



School Supply Checklist

Everyone: Scissors, three glue sticks, one bottle of white glue, colored pencils, crayons, markers, pencils, eraser, personal white board (about 9x12), 2 to 4 white board markers, white board eraser (small rag), highlighter, basic water color set with brush, sticky page tabs, clear tap, simple planner, and small personal timer

***Please keep these items on the *small* (12 to 36 range) side. Bring them to the schoolhouse in a pencil box or pencil pouch. For items easily used up or lost, keep replacements at home and re-stock as needed. For part-time students, these items can be brought back and forth in the student's backpack, if desired. (Small white board is not kept in pencil box/pouch.)

*** For all binders listed, please make sure they are a hard, clear view cover three-ring binder. Color does not matter.

Language Arts Level K

(Group small items in a large, name labeled Ziplock bag)

- 300 index cards (3 by 5), white or colored (Lined or unlined)
- Small Ziplock bag with roughly 30 dried beans, buttons, or place marker
- One basic paper plate
- 100 (about) cotton balls
- Small ball of yarn (just something you have left over)
- One box (of multiple snack packs) of shelf stable snacks (preferred by your child)
Examples: cereal, goldfish, raisins
- Fun pointer (examples: straw, feather, or wand)
- A one-inch binder with 30 sheets of age-appropriate writing paper
- Three, quart sized freezer strength Ziplock bags

Language Arts Level One

(Group small items in a large, name-labeled Ziplock bag)

- 300 index cards (3 by 5), white or colored
- Basic poster paint set and paint brush
- Sandwich size bag of Q-tips
- One box (of multiple snack packs) of shelf stable snacks (preferred by your child)
Examples: cereal, goldfish, raisins
- 100 (about) cotton balls
- Small ball of string
- One small flowerpot
- A spoon (any kind)
- Fun pointer (examples: straw, feather, or wand)

- Craft sticks (at least 100, plain or colored, small)
- Small package of balloons
- A one-inch binder with 30 sheets of age-appropriate writing paper
- Three, quart-sized freezer strength Ziplock bags

Language Arts Level Two

(Group small items in a large, name labeled Ziplock bag)

- 300 index cards (3 by 5), white or colored
- Basic poster paint set and paint brush

- One box (of multiple snack packs) of shelf stable snacks (preferred by your child)

- One college-ruled spiral notebook
- Small sandwich bag of Q-tips
- A one-inch binder with 30 sheets of age-appropriate writing paper
- Three, quart sized freezer strength Ziplock bags
- One art board (Amazon Example: Saunders 05607, 19 by 14.5 is big enough, you can purchase larger if desired)

Language Arts Level Five

(Group small items in a large, name labeled Ziplock bag)

- One small package of LARGE index cards (5x7)
- Watercolor set (dry cakes—not tubes) Suggestions: Hobbylobby.com (search for 106740), Amazon.com (search for B018ZY494A)
- Paintbrushes and palette (or a white plate)
- Watercolor paper (9" x 12", at least 140 lb paper, at least 16 sheets)
- One college-ruled spiral notebook
- Three, quart sized freezer strength Ziplock bags
- One art board (Amazon Example: Saunders 05607, 19 by 14.5 is big enough, you can purchase larger if desired)

Language Arts Level Six

(Group small items in a large, name labeled Ziplock bag)

- Tracing paper
- A set of chalk pastels (at least 24 colors—must include white and off -white) Suggestions from Amazon.com: search for NuPastel 36
- A kneaded eraser, art tape, and a workable spray fixative Like B012561WIA, AA20132, and K01306 on Amazon.com (Note: Painter's tape can work in place of art tape.)
- Charcoal pencil (any kind) Like GP05630 on Amazon.com
- Watercolor or pastel paper (assorted colors, 9"x12") Like 100510864 on Amazon.com Mi-Teintes Pastel Pad, Assorted Colors 9"X12"
- Blending stumps or Cotton Swabs (Like B002ER8MOC on Amazon.com. Blending stumps allow for more detailed blending.)
- One college-ruled spiral notebook
- Three, quart sized freezer strength Ziplock bags
- One art board (Amazon Example: Saunders 05607, 19 by 14.5 is big enough, you can purchase larger if desired)

(Group small items in a large, name labeled Ziplock bag)

- One small package of LARGE index cards
- A set of drawing pencils (with eraser) Suggestions from Amazon.com: search for RSET-KCSS OR 497BP
- A sketchbook (9x 12) Suggestions from Amazon.com: search for BOO27ACAPY OR BOO27A39PY
- One college-ruled spiral notebook
- Three, quart sized freezer strength Ziplock bags
- One art board (Amazon Example: Saunders 05607, 19 by 14.5 is big enough, you can purchase larger if desired)

Math Level One

(Group small items in a large, name labeled Ziplock bag)

- Centimeter and inch ruler (12-inches, shows centimeters and millimeters)
- A few brown paper lunch bags
- 30 feet of yarn

- Small box of toothpicks
- Small amount of playdough or clay

Math Keys to Series

(Group small items in a large, name labeled Ziplock bag)

- Centimeter and inch ruler (12-inches, shows centimeters and millimeters)
- Scientific calculator (TI-30X IIS or TI – 30XA preferred)
- One set of stacking fractions/percents/decimals manipulatives (See this one on Amazon: Learning Resources Fraction Tower Activity Set)

History

- One-inch binder with about 50 sheets of age appropriate writing paper
